 - Conflicts in or with state agencies or institutions



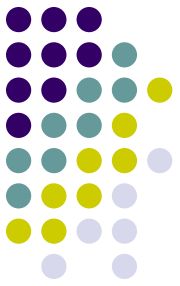
I. Pursuit of Health Care Reform

- Met with all State Representatives' and Senators' offices in Washington DC re: psychologists and the Health Care reform debate



I. Pursuit of Health Care Reform (Cont)



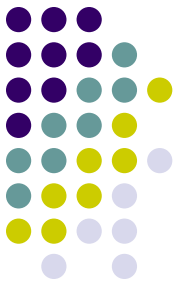
- Legislative advocacy at federal and state levels

- Went to Montgomery on three separate occasions to meet with law makers about mental health issues

I. Pursuit of Health Care Reform (Cont)

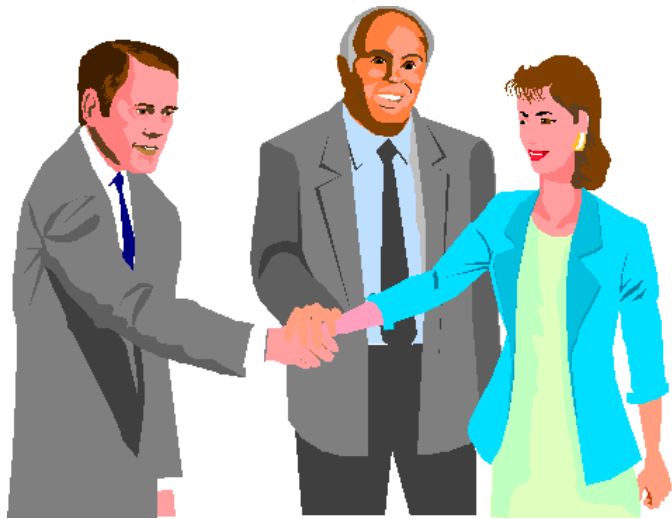


- Legislative advocacy at federal and state levels
- Development of relationships with legislators
- Develop relationships with other practice Disciplines
- Partnered with NAMI (Alabama), Department of Mental Health and Wings Over Alabama to lobby on Mental Health Day on the Hill
- Attended a Public Hearing in response to decision to oppose SB342 (Faith Based Bill)

I. Pursuit of Health Care Reform (Cont)

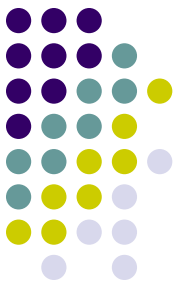


- Development of relationships with insurance representatives



- Met with the Deputy Medicaid Commissioner in response to Medicaid budget cuts to psychologists and the re-categorization of psychologists as “Mid-level providers”
- Got an agreement to maintain our appropriate provider status

I. Pursuit of Health Care Reform (Cont)



- Development of relationships with insurance representatives



- Several meetings with Medicaid led to the reversal of their proposed 20% cut in reimbursement
- Continue to work with Medicaid on standards for psychologists
- Developed a aPA/ALPA joint committee on Insurance and Third party Payer issues

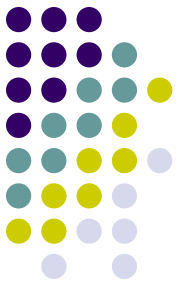

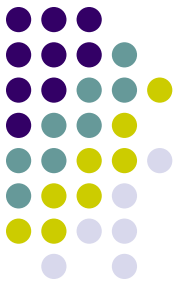

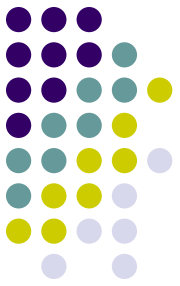

- Psychology Promotes Healthy Living and Health Living Promotes Psychology!!

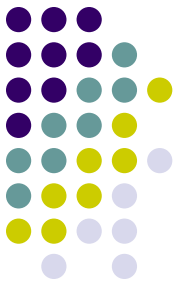

- 20% cut in Medicaid reimbursement for psychologists averted



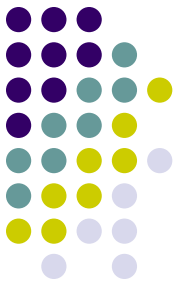
II. Improvement of the status and role of psychologists in current and future health care and educational systems



- Improved relationship to and collaboration with the Alabama Board of Examiners in Psychology
- More than a dozen members attended the March 2010 BOEP meeting
- Executive Council has communicated with the BOEP about concerns members have reported re: the current investigatory and disciplinary process
- Members met and discussed concerns with the BOEP during the May 2010 meeting.

III. Improvement in Communication to Members

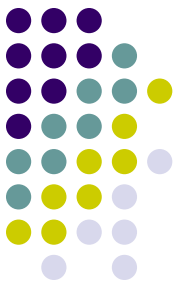


- Increase the efficiency of the EC

- Recent By-Law changes allowing for electronic voting by the EC when necessary

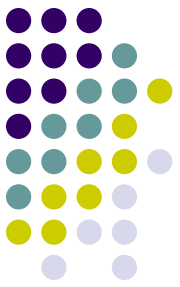
III. Improvement in Communication to Members (cont)

- Frequent updates on situations posted on website, list serv, facebook and twitter



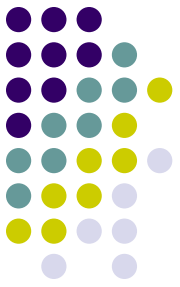
III. Improvement in Communication to Members (cont)

- Forum added to the website to provide members the opportunity for more lengthy discussions regarding specific issues/interests



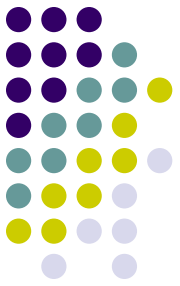
